Dogs are able to deal with unusual situations and the likes of wheelchairs, walking frames, hospital and rehab equipment all the while being friendly without being boisterous.

The owner/handlers should too possess certain people skills and be sensitive to the ways of elderly and the unwell.

- Provide support to children during school times: especially reading, VCE Cramming Sessions
- Host Therapy Dog Sessions each year at the Melbourne University Student Medical Doctors Annual Conference
