Trainee Logbook

This book is designed to keep a record of your progress within the scheme.

It is suggested that you use a folder to keep the Logbook and the records of your structured and unstructured workshops together, along with details of Judging/Stewarding appointments as they occur.

Trainees can use this Logbook to keep a record of the practical experience required before you can sit for the Written and Practical Assessments. This Logbook will be used as evidence for the Training, Stewarding and Judging experiences documented on your application form.

Each activity must be confirmed by an accredited Trainer/ Mentor or Trial Secretary. Trial Secretaries contact details need to be recorded on the final page. Experiences recorded can include “Stewarding at Trials”, “Judging at club competitions etc.” If a current licence is held, details of Judging appointments should be included.

You will be provided with an application form which will be backed up with the evidence contained in this Logbook. You will also have practical workshop Training and Assessment Sheets.
